As we reflect on the suffering, death and resurrection of Christ this year, I am reminded of the ministry of reconciliation to which God has called each one of us and especially the mandate of Partners in Mission. Paul the Apostle in 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 states thus;

17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! 18 All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: 19 that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. 20 We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. 21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

God has called us ambassadors, agents of this life transforming message having been transformed ourselves by the finished work of Christ on the cross. This has been and remains our task, to witness to Christ among others and draw them to him, for reconciliation and restoration. The Lord has commissioned us to go and reach the work with this message of reconciliation and hope. We are also glad for all who have supported us to fulfill this mandate in the unreached communities of rural Uganda like here in Kamwenge.
