A stable foundation

Good Shepherd Kindergarten and Primary School will this year for a third time do national examinations (PLE) that enables children to go from Primary to secondary level. It's a sign of progress and we thank God. We continually encourage the students to acquire a vocational skill in addition to the academic paper such that they can be self reliant whether they go up to university or for some reason fail to make it that far. The school was set up to give the children a values-based foundation to learning and life. With growing numbers, we are looking to increase the classroom space as well as set up for the pupils a Library and computer lab seperate from the Secondary section. The center for Culinary and hospitality training has had tremendous impact on the community with our students emerging stars in major Ugandan hotels where they do internship. We are even setting up a restaurant at the Inspiration Center a couple kilometers away from the school on the Highway to help the students gain experience in hospitality. We are also setting up charcoal and firewood ovens to save on power and gas costs. Besides, it's a more affordable oven if the students were to engage in production in the community.



FARMING FOR

Having done several pilots in agriculture, we believe that it is the way to go to empower our community for improved livelihoods, food security and increased household income. We have had successful pilots for Upland Rice, Coffee and have now established gardens that for the moment are intercropped with bananas. We also have stocked fish ponds and seperate banana plantations. We now look to establish a dairy unit that will supply mik to the school. This agriculture is the antidote to the scourge of malnutrition in our community. Many of our children are disabled mentaly because of malnutrition. We also hope to use the health unit at the school to senstize the community on proper feeding and balanced diets for healthy living.

A BLESSING OF

Overtime, we have had several of our former students graduate from universities and other tertiray institutions. We are even seeing some excell with first class degrees. Glory to God! We believe that every support that affords our former students a chance at tertiary education especially for those academically bright but needy students is surely worth it. May the Lord continue to bless all who are making this a reality, giving these students hope.

It's a dozen years since we launched the work of transforming the Kamwenge community through offering holisitic education and giving hope to the people.

What we see now is a ray of hope for a people who are now eagerly reaching out to embrace education not only as an alternative way to a brighter future but as the only way to achieve it. We see it in some of our former students who have gone through tertiary institutions coming back to their community, serving as teachers at school, or taking on several trades to serve to the community.

We are seeing parents sending their children to school and trying their hand at small scale commercial agriculture from a lifestyle of hopelessness or pure subsistence farming.

We are seeing some of our former students excell with first class degrees

at University level and others taking leadership. We see them going ahead to serve in the Ugandan military force, the Police, in private organizations as well as in businesses.

We believe that in a period of ten or so years of sustained effort in the community, we'll be able to raise a self relaiant people who are food secure, healthy and even progressively influencing the other communities around them.

Our gratitude is immeasurable when we see these things. We are thankful for all our partners and friends who have made this story of transformation a reality.
